Entrances to hells gate. -ksh. 300 per person. Swimming charges in geothermal spa- ksh. 400 / person. Tour leader - 700 ksh per person.

The above charges are only **applicable for Kenyan citizens with Kenyan identity card**. The all activities may take 4 to 6 hours depending on the level of enjoyment. **For non Kenyan citizens**, The charges will be 26 usd per person entrances to hells gate national park. And 1800 ksh per person for swimming in geothermal spar. The rest of the charges will remain the same.
